Policy paper discusses effect of food and energy prices—and how producers can cope

A new policy paper by Nebraska Ethanol Board Chairman Jim Jenkins describes the relationship between food and energy prices—and how livestock producers can adopt new practices for greater efficiency and profits.

As a rancher, restaurant owner, and proponent of renewable energies like ethanol, Jenkins has witnessed the effect of rising energy and food prices from a unique perspective.
